## Dear Mr. Secretary:

A draft toxicological profile from the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry assesses the risks from exposure to a subset of PFAS chemicals, showing that they pose a significantly greater threat to human health than previously estimated. We, the undersigned public interest organizations, call on you to fulfill your agency's mission and provide Americans with critical information about their health by releasing this document immediately.

PFAS chemicals are potent toxicants linked to cancer, liver and thyroid damage, developmental impacts, and numerous other adverse health effects, including harming our immune systems. The government should be sharing information about these dangers, not hiding it.

In the absence of meaningful action from the Environmental Protection Agency, states have taken the lead to protect us from PFAS chemicals. The ATSDR study can provide vital intelligence to states seeking to clean up PFAS-contaminated drinking water that threatens millions of Americans.

We call on you to release the ATSDR report immediately so Americans know what's in the water we drink, and states, public health officials and local water utilities are armed with the best-available science on these dangerous chemicals. Thank you for your attention.
